He is a graduate of Harvard Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center (MSKCC) in the Division of Hematologic Oncology and was the recipient of a National Institutes of Health Physician-Scientist Grand for research studying the genetic basis of leukemia. He is a graduate of Harvard College and the State University of the New York at Stony Brook School of Medicine, from which he received an MD with Distinction in Research. He served his internal medicine residency at the Columbia Presbyterian Medical Center, NYC and Hematology/Oncology Fellowship at MKSCC. In 2005, Dr. Frank was awarded the Humanitarian Award by the Leukemia-Lymphoma Society of Fairfield County for his commitment to patient care and education. In 2007, he was one of three physicians honored nationwide with the David King Community Clinical Scientist Award from the Association of Community Cancer Centers. He has been repeatedly selected by his peers as one of Connecticut's "Top Doctors" in surveys published in Connecticut Magazine. Dr. Frank is the author of numerous medical and scientific articles and lectures frequently to the public on lymphoma and myeloma, new cancer therapies and the importance of cancer clinical trials.

Dr. Frank grew up on Long Island and is a graduate of Westbury High School. He currently lives with his wife, two sons and dog in Fairfield, CT. In his spare time, he plays tenor saxophone in the (almost) all-physician Rock and Roll band DNR.

Presentation on Memory by Dr. Mark Gluck '81 September 8, 2009

Lost your glasses again? Worried your memory isn't as sharp as it used to be? Join us for a lively, informative, and useful tour of your brain. You will learn how memories are formed, why some are retained and others forgotten, and how memory changes as we age. Dr. Mark Gluck will share the latest news on Alzheimer's disease, as well as important information on how other brain diseases -- such as Parkinson's, schizophrenia, and drug addiction -- can impair memory and cognition. The talk will end with a practical guide to maintaining and improving your memory, including what you can do to reduce your risk for Alzheimer's disease. The presentation will be held at the Holiday Inn in Stamford located at 700 E. Main Street. The dinner and presentation will begin at 7:00 p.m. and be preceded by cocktails beginning at 6:30 p.m.

Dr. Mark Gluck is Professor of Neuroscience at Rutgers University-Newark, co-director of the Rutgers Memory Disorders Project, director of the Center for Collaborative Research on Cognition and Parkinson's Disease, publisher of the free public health newsletter, Memory Loss and the Brain, and co-author of several books including a new undergraduate textbook, Learning and Memory: From Brain to Behavior. He has received several scientific awards including a NSF Presidential Early Career Award from President Bill Clinton. Dr. Gluck received his BA from Harvard and a PhD from Stamford.
